
















As a freshman he earned Varsity MVP honors on his cross country team after an amazing season. He placed 7th at the varsity district meet and missed out on qualifying to the UIL Texas State Cross Country championships by seven seconds after placing 20th at the Region 4 Cross Country meet. During the track season of his freshman year, he carried his momentum into the distance events all spring long. After failing to qualify to the Area meet in the 3200m run, Hector focused his attention on the 1600m run, the event he ultimately qualified in to the Regional track meet in. At San Antonio, Hector ran a huge personal best time of 4:30 in the mile run. With a strong

freshman year to build on and an outstanding summer mileage buildup, Hector was among the top finishers in every meet he competed in during his sophomore cross country season. The hard work and dedication he put forward paid off as he once again qualified to the Regional Cross Country meet after a runner-up finish at the district meet. He followed that performance up with a fifth place finish at Regionals to punch his ticket to state. He was the first person from his school to qualify for the state meet since 2008. At state, he again ran a great race to finish 30th in a crowded field. During track, Hector was poised to make a run at qualifying to the state meet before the season was prematurely cut short by the COVID 19 pandemic. Hector will no doubt cement his status



as one the best runnersto come out of the Rio Grande Valley before his high school career comes to end. His goals of earning a track scholarship to schools like the University of Oregon and Texas are well within reach. His work on the course carries over into the classroom where he ranks amongst the top of his class. Despite living in one of the poorest counties in the country, Hector fuels himself with the support of his family and community to represent his school, city and family in such a proud way.
