



Just a few years ago Isaiah Frank at the age of 9 years old sat down and penciled a few goals for his upcoming baseball season. Some were team goals and some were individual. One individual goal that was an emphasis of Isaiah's dreams was to be appointed to the top all star team in his age group. Every evening when there were no games or practice schedule, young Isaiah, (who would later be tagged as Grunt, because of short, deep sounds he releases when swinging a bat or hurling a pitch) would willfully take pitching lessons or work on some aspect of defense or hitting. He was driven to hit over .400, have a winning record and most importantly make the Purple Bulldogs All Star team.

After a long and very successful season that ranked him amongst the top pitchers in his Little League, Isaiah had achieved his ultimate goal and was voted by coaches to join the All Star team. His hard work had paid off.

But.... the story doesn't end here. After contributing to several tournament championships and a second place finish at Districts.. losing by one run to an 11

year old All Star team from the same Little League, his dreams would have a sudden rude awakening. The following year with the same goal in mind, the now 10 year old player continued to set goals and outwork team mates and opponents. His numbers were again tops in the league, however, as is the case in so many youth athletic programs in America, he was snubbed by coaches/fathers that had a different set of objectives. That old phrase "daddyball" had chopped the head off of Isaiah's dream. He was passed over for players that weren't even close statistically, athletically and most certainly did not have his work ethic, leaving him shocked and very sad.

Grunt's story could have easily ended here, but like most driven athletes, his journey was just about to begin. Stinging from the decision of grown men tearing an earned opportunity from the pages of his story, Isaiah stood up and claimed, "I will leave no doubt!" He made a decision to step away from club and recreational baseball and set out to find an elite travel program. After playing a year with a sound 11U team and batting right at .300, recording


33 strikeouts and 20 walks, Grunt realizes his new goal of one day being a high level travel player and a member of his High School team was going to be more difficult than he thought. To the shock of everyone close to the ambitious athlete, he stepped up his game another notch. Adding more hitting instructions, workouts after practices and a nutrition regimen, he set out to begin his 12U season under the guidance of a highly qualified coaching staff, unlike one he'd ever experienced outside of private instructors. These coaches saw something in Isaiah and began to mold him into what may very well be the most consistent and possibly the most effective pitcher in the state for his age.


This brings us to the present stage of Isaiah to many other "Grunt" Frank's young baseball career. At this writing the freshly turned 12 year old has faced no doubt!" Ha 131 batters recording 55 strikeouts and only

giving up a remarkable 2 walks. With an era of 1.652 and throwing strikes at a rate of 71% the righty is leaving hitters baffled with his change of speed, accuracy and pure confidence on the hill.

In addition to his pitching prowess, Grunt is batting .418, leading his team in hits and two-baggers with a home run. He's second in stolen bases, runs scored and has emerged as a leader on defense.

As a multi sport athlete with a 4.0 grade average, Isaiah Frank is an athlete deserving of recognition. 





My goal is to become a Professional Surfer and to become a world champion.

Professional hockey players were not born as a professional- they train, dedicated, and they become. And I believe I will succeed!!!


