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

















I'm Arina Churaeva from Moscow. I am 8 years old now.






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Hi my name is Hayden Delong I'm 15 years old and I have been skating since I was four years old.


I really wanted to quit hockey because I didn't think I was good enough but because of him I know I am.










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Kalīna Mītsova




GH eve Nendoza

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



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
