
Christian is currently ranked the #18 basketball player in the class of 2028 by Middle School Elite national basketball rankings.


Reagan works hard at her sport every day. It's not easy to travel and practice so much while keeping practices every day at home when she's not at a team practice with a pitching or hitting coach.
